The "Art for Food Holiday Art Sale" will showcase the work of our art students while raising needed funds for the Glen South Food Bank. Full details of the project are included.

Glen South Regional High School Senior Class Proposal for the Art for Food Holiday Art Class

According to a study conducted by Feeding America in 2014, over 900,000 people in the state of New Jersey rely on food banks. Each year, food banks in New Jersey provide over 7,700,000 meals to people in need. Clearly, hunger is a significant problem throughout the state.

We at Glen South Regional High School have an opportunity to come together as a community and make a positive contribution to the problem of hunger in our area. The Senior Class proposes holding the "Art for Food Holiday Art Sale," featuring the work of our talented art students. The profits from this sale would be donated to the Glen South Food Bank, which serves the hungry in our own area. We believe that participating students will benefit from this service learning experience, by increasing their awareness of the greater community, and understanding that even a small act of generosity can make a big difference.

The "Art for Food Holiday Art Sale" will be scheduled for Friday, December 9, 2016, from 7 pm to 9 pm, and Saturday, December 10, 2016, from 10 am to 4 pm. These dates will allow shoppers who are looking for a unique gift to purchase an original work of art created by our students in time for the holidays. We request the use of the high school cafeteria for this event, because it is a flexible space which can accommodate many people comfortably. A flyer which will be used to advertise the event is provided as Appendix 1.

The Friday evening session would feature an Opening Night reception, with entertainment provided by our GSRHS musical ensembles: Jazz Band, Wind Ensemble, String Ensemble, Madrigal Choir and Knights Choir. During the reception, the artists would be available near their work to discuss it with patrons and answer questions. We expect that the atmosphere will be elegant and festive, with patrons sipping sparkling cider and nibbling on

finger foods, which will be donated by local businesses. There will be a table available for patrons who wish to donate non-perishable food items or cash to support the Food Bank. All donors will be entered into a drawing for prized donated by local businesses.

The Saturday session will continue the art portion of the art show, but will be structured for shopping only. By providing both evening and daytime hours, we hope to maximize the number of shoppers who will visit the show.

The artwork for the sale will be created by our students in all art courses. We expect that the art teachers will encourage their students to participate in this good cause, and hope they might consider assigning a project specifically to support the sale. We expect to have artwork in many media, including drawings, paintings, sculptures, photography and digital art. The art teachers and the student artists will determine a fair price for the work together.

A project of this magnitude will require a combined effort of teachers, parents, students and the administration. As stated above, the Art Department and Music Department will be key contributors to the Holiday Art Show. In addition to the Senior Class, various school organizations will contribute to the success of this event. For example, the TV Production Club will prepare a promotional video to be broadcast to the entire school community, and submitted to our local cable provider for advance publicity. The Leo's Club will provide babysitting services during the event to enable patrons to shop conveniently.

The project will also require a significant effort from our parents. Our project chairperson will present the proposal at the first Home & School Association meeting of the year in September, and will recruit interested parents who will lead various committees, in partnership with a Senior student leader. The main committees and their functions are detailed in the table below.

At the end of the art show, a celebration including pizza and beverages will be provided to thank our students and volunteers. In addition, all students and volunteers will receive a letter of thanks and a certificate to recognize their participation in the event. Patrons will be able to pick up their purchases at the completion of the event on Saturday, and free delivery will be available for anyone who is unable to pick up their artwork at that time.
